



Object pronouns vs Subject pronouns

Grammar Lesson: Object pronouns vs Subject pronouns (A1)

Active Voice Pairs

(Shows the shift from subject to object.)

- * **I** play football. → Football plays **me**.
- * **You** play football. → Football plays **you**.
- * **He** plays football. → Football plays **him**.
- * **She** plays football. → Football plays **her**.
- * **It** (The dog) plays football. → Football plays **it** (the dog).
- * **We** play football. → Football plays **us**.
- * **They** play football. → Football plays **them**.

Subject Pronouns

- Subject: Before the verb
- Subject pronouns are the subject of a verb. They go before the verb.
- _I_ _like your dress._
- _You_ _are late._
- _He_ _is my friend._
- _It_ _often rains_ .
- _She_ _is on holiday._
- _We_ _live in England._
- _They_ _come from London._

Object Pronouns

- Object: After the verb
- Object pronouns are the object of a verb. They go after the verb.
- Can you help **me**, please?
- I can see **you**.
- She doesn't like **him**.
- I see **her** every Monday.
- We can see **him**, but he can't see **us**.

Object Pronouns (Continued)

- After preposition
- We use **object pronouns** after prepositions.
- She is there **for me**.
- I'll get it **for you**.
- Give it **to him**.
- Can you listen **to her**?
- Don't take it **from us**.
- I want to speak **to them**.
