Have got: Form

- ##### Have got (British English) = have (American English)
- The verb **have got** is a common form used in the UK, mainly when people are speaking. In the US, people use the verb **have**.
- - **_I've got** a car. = I have a car._
- - **_I haven't got** a car. = I don't have a car._
- - **_Have you got** a car? = Do you have a car?_

Be Careful with This Common Mistake!

- The verb **have got** only has a present form (NOT past).
- - **_I had got** a car.
- - **_I had** a car.
- - **_I hadn't got** a car. !
- - **_I didn't have** a car.
- - **_Had** you **got** car? !
- - **_Did** you **have** car?

Have got: Use - Possession, Family

- _She's **got** a nice apartment._
- _**Have** you **got** a computer?_
- _I **haven't got** any brothers or sisters._

Have got: Use - Illnesses

- _I've **got** a headache._
- _She's **got** a cold._

Have got: Use - Physical Descriptions

- _He's **got** brown hair and a long nose._
- _They've **got** blue eyes._
